Councillor Deborah Sanger, Deputy Mayor

Deputy Mayor Councillor Deborah Sanger has been a member of the council since 2019 and describes her arrival in Okehampton as a happy accident, having come from Yorkshire, via Bude, with her husband's job move almost ten years ago.

Always keen to contribute to her local community she has been a volunteer, sung with local choirs, played with ukulele groups, and even started Okehampton's regular folk club, the Okey Folky.

Councillor Sanger agreed to reveal two unusual facts about herself. She recently discovered percussive dancing, which is done in ordinary hard soled shoes, and she can often be found stepping along at local folk sessions.

In a new venture, last year she bought two Kunekune pigs and all three grandchildren are keen to greet the first piglets this summer although she is expecting it all to be a very steep learning curve.

Although Councillor Sanger lives outside of the immediate town in the growing area of Okehampton Hamlets, she thinks all residents both old and new should feel proud of, and connected to, the ancient town of Okehampton. She says, "as well as our wonderful moorland setting, we also have the remnants of the most south-westerly Roman settlement in Britain so it's been a place people have chosen to live for a very long time indeed".

'Oakehampton' Clock



In 2019 a clock, minus any casing, was donated to the Council. Mr Vachon, a former Town Councillor, has kindly donated materials, his time and skills, and fitted the clock into casing. The clock is now operational and located in the Council Chamber.

Mr Vachon says, 'It was a typical long-case clock with brass dial with etched 'Oakehampton' and the maker's name – John Nottle.' It is believed that the clock was made sometime in the mid 1700's.

Council Grants Awarded

The Council has a budget for the award of grants supporting community organisations and groups to the benefit of the residents of Okehampton. The criteria and details of how to apply can be found at www.okehampton.gov.uk/grants.php.

The grant budget for the 2021/22 financial

year is £37,358, unspent funds from the previous year having been added.

In May, a grant of £3,500 was presented to the Museum of Dartmoor Life by Cllr Tolley when he cut the ribbon for its seasonal opening.



Additionally, in May a grant of £1,500 was awarded to the Tourist Information Facility.

June saw the approval of two applications:

- •£220 Okehampton Fairtrade Group towards a leaflet celebrating 10 years of the Fairtrade status of the town
- •£73.85 South Western Ambulance Charity, equipment for the Okehampton Community First Responder volunteer.

Fairplace Sensory Garden



In 2019 the Council took ownership and responsibility for the public toilets and garden area at this location and have been working to create a sensory garden.

WDBC have contributed £1,565 from s.106 funding towards the project which will provide an area full of plants and flowers that are bee, butterfly and insect friendly. A splash of colour in the centre of the town which will be full of different sounds and smells.



The tree for the centre of the garden, a

flowering Chinese Dogwood, also known as a China Girl tree, which was donated during last summer is flourishing and flowering well.

Just a few more plants are needed to finish the garden which will mature over the coming years.

West Bridge Wildflower Verge

The verge, which is owned by the Town Council and maintained by its Parks Team, is starting to bloom with a variety of wildflowers. A donation towards the cost of the seeds was received last year from Okement Rivers Improvement Group.



Zip Wire



The zip wire in Simmons Park, which is one of the most popular items of play equipment, has been out of action for several weeks having been deemed unsafe.

Its replacement is due to be considered by Parks Committee when they meet in early July.

Clapps Wood

Unfortunately, this area of woodland has been hit by ash-tree dieback with all the ash trees therein being infected, totalling approximately 60% of its trees. It is with sadness that the Council will be considering quotations for their felling in line with specialist recommendation.

Remaining trees, who will suddenly find themselves without the shelter they previously had, will be regularly checked for stability meaning that some may need to be pruned or felled for safety purposes.

It is the intention of the Council to replant the woodland and a scheme is being drawn up for implementation, hopefully, in 2022.
