Opening of the Dartmoor Line Rail Service

The Mayor, Cllr Bob Tolley, Town Councillors and the Town Clerk were all invited to the opening event on Wednesday 17th November 2021 and had the opportunity to take a short return journey to Bow.



Cllr Dr Michael Ireland, Chairman of OkeRail, who has been working with Network Rail and GWR to get the service restarted for many years, was delighted to have been one of the first to be welcomed aboard the Dartmoor Line.

Budget and Precept for 2022/23

The budget and precept setting process for the 2022/23 financial year which starts on 1st April is well underway, the Committees having reviewed an initial budget proposal.

Full Council will be reviewing the whole budget proposal on 20th December and making a final decision towards the end of January. Copies of the budget proposals made so far can found within the meeting reports on the Council website or obtained from the office.

Has your plastic waste been brought back into use in the town?

Additional picnic benches are being provided by the Council in Simmons Park near the play area one of which will be suitable for wheelchair users. A new bench is also being provided by the public toilets in Market Street, replacing one removed earlier in the year which was rotten and beyond repair.

Devon Contract Waste, who collect the Town Council's waste, are recycling their plastic waste and made it into other products including the benches purchased by the Council.

So, it is possible that your plastic waste has gone full circle and returned to the town for long term use of residents and visitors.

Zip Wire Update

Grants towards the replacement of the zip wire have been awarded to the Council by WDBC £5,000 and Okehampton Hamlets Parish Council £1,000. The remaining balance of approximately £10,000 being funded by the Town Council.

An installation date is awaited.

Clapps Wood – Ash Dieback Update

Felling of the trees in the woodland area that are affected by ash dieback has been delayed because of the need to obtain a felling licence from the Forestry Commission.

The felling is now planned to commence on 10th January, and it is anticipated that it will take between two to three weeks to complete work during which time the footpath will be closed for health and safety purposes.

Council Grants Awarded

The Council has a budget of £37,358 this year for the award of grants supporting community organisations and groups for the benefit of the residents of Okehampton.
