Firstly, thank you so much for your very kind and much appreciated donation last year. We are currently coping with growing demand for counselling at the same time as we face a huge increase in competition for funding caused by many charities' inability to hold their regular fundraising activities through lockdown, so your generous contribution was very welcome!

The £500 contributed towards 2 clients' allowance of 8 counselling sessions. Each session currently costs £47, with £376 paying for the entire 8 sessions. We regularly collate feedback from our clients and know that our services have a very positive impact on the lives of the young people we support, so once again thank you for helping us to offer this service.

 - a) The grant contributed to our company being able to stay open and help people through the various lockdowns during 2021.
 - b) The project was an online vocal provision for people with respiratory problems, either COPD or the after effects of covid 19.

The sessions use breathing warm up techniques as a preparation for singing. This is the most important bit of the session in terms of relieving symptoms of respiratory illness, but the songs then add interest. As one participant said 'it makes the physio fun!'

15 people attended the six sessions, and although we didn't get postcode details we can report that for the most part they were referred by the Social Prescribing team at Okehampton Medical Centre.

The evidence gained by our organisation from this pilot project has been included in a bid to the National Lottery Community Fund and I can report that we are through to the next stage of the application procedure.

As the funding was used to pay music workers salaries there ae no additional receipts to show for this project, and salaries are identified in our audited accounts for the year 20220/21 which are available on the Charity Commission website, and I am happy to send you a copy if you would prefer.

Small Grant Application for Tor Support Services Charity Number 1163407

Question 1: The principal role of the organisation.

Tor Support Services (TSS) is a local charity providing free, confidential counselling to 5-25-year olds from Okehampton and surrounding parishes. With mental health services over-extended nationally, particularly for young people, and a rise in numbers seeking support, the charity delivers an important service to local young people.

Question 2: Total Membership

Our team of 10 counsellors, including a number of volunteers, see an average of 35 young people each week and over a year we deliver well over 1000 counselling sessions and support over 150 young people. Each client is offered up to 8 free counselling sessions, with some requiring fewer and a few needing slightly longer-term support.

Question 3: How does the organisation benefit the community?

TSS offers children and young people a unique and vital service through giving them an opportunity to confide in someone and speak out about experiences or feelings which are having a detrimental impact on their mental and physical health. Through early intervention we believe we are offering these individuals a lifeline, the benefits of which will hopefully help shape both their own future development and that of the community. Okehampton College is our largest single referrer with local parents and primary school staff forming the next two groups of referrers.

Question 4: Of the total membership, approx. how many reside in Okehampton?

In 2019/20 69% of our clients came from Okehampton College with a further 27% from local primary schools. With the pressures of the pandemic we are seeing increased demand across all age groups.

Question 5: Average number of members attending each meeting?

Our clients are seen on a one to one basis with each child receiving 8 sessions (sometimes more if necessary).

Questions 7 and 8: Please state what the grant will be used for and how it will benefit Okehampton residents?

Tor Support Services has been providing confidential counselling services from its base at Okehampton College since 2009. Our clients are local children and young people, aged 5 - 25, who are referred to us with a wide range of issues, from anxiety and depression to be eavement or parental separation, behavioural problems, substance abuse or self-harm.

Our per session cost (including a contribution to the cost of the service manager, general administration, clinical team co-ordination, supervision and related costs) of £47 will deliver a one-hour counselling session. £376 will support one young person through a course of 8 sessions.

With constant and growing, demand for the service across all ages, our aim is to increase the number of people we reach, once again, in 2022. We currently have a waiting list of 50+ local young people in crisis across both primary and secondary age ranges.

Dear Clerk and Okehampton Town Councillors

I am writing on behalf of the Ockment Centre to apply for a grant of £5,000 for the current financial year (ending in April 2022) to help towards staffing our reception.

Having the Town Council support the Centre really means a lot to us. As a team we are passionate about the Community Centre and providing the best service we can. The support from the Town Council helps towards keeping our reception staffed, having a warm welcome with knowledgeable signposting services is a huge asset for the local community.

Having your support is extremely helpful when applying for funding. This financial year we have so far received funding from United Charities to continue our Work Club, a grant from Arnold Clark towards a roof replacement and funding from West Devon Borough Council for outside furniture for our garden.

The Centre re opened in April in a COVID safe way when the restrictions lifted, initially for 3 days a week. This enabled us to condense our bookings as they were hugely reduced this was more financially viable to save energy costs and make use of the governments JRS scheme. As our bookings increased we gradually increased our opening and are now back to our usual opening days. Although increasing, our income from room hire and refreshments is still far less than before the pandemic. We have started offering takeaway catering options to help which seems to be going well.

The Citizens Advice have been based at the Centre for many years which is invaluable to the Centre. We are in discussions to hold the Foodbank parcels to distribute again and have agreed for the Community fridge to be situated in the Ockment Centre.

I have attached our latest accounts.

My first involvement was when I attended various courses in the building. Including, The European Computer Driving Licence, First Aid in the Workplace and a day's workshop on using a Defibrillator. Apart from the facilities inside the building one of the most striking impressions was the welcome I received at the reception desk. If you are new and a perhaps a little nervous a warm welcome and a smiling face is exactly what you need.

Since those days my involvement with Citizens Advice has made me a frequent visitor. During my time with the "Hub" I witnessed first hand how centre staff welcomed and assisted visitors, putting them completely at ease often with the offer of a cup of tea.

But for this happen the reception desk needs to be manned this can prove very difficult at times, especially when the staff are providing catering for meetings and groups that are taking place, as the kitchen is at the other end of the building.

If this application is successful then it will go someway to ensuring that a member of staff will always be available while the centre is open to the public.



Please accept this application on behalf of Okehampton United Charity, specifically relating to the provision of allotments in Okehampton. Okehampton United Charity currently provides three sites in the Town and Hamlets for the provision of allotments. There are 90 allotment holders, and all three sites are fully let. The annual rent for an allotment is due to rise from £35 per annum to £50 per annum over the next 3 years (starting in September 2022). The cost of providing the allotments is shown below:

 We run a number of projects in Okehampton, enabling music making and arts involvement for allages. We have six projects based in the town which will be ready to start again when restrictions are lifted.
 - a. Instrument Picnic and Songs Around the World: project for children under five and theirparents/carers. This project has funding from The Ragdoll Foundation and The National Foundation for Youth Music.
 - b. For The Record: A professional development programme funded by Erasmus+ (European Union)for training community musicians to work with older adults in residential care homes. The project will use life stories from residents to create community celebration events.
 - c.. The West Devon Folk Choir: A weekly choir for people to come together and learn folk songs, often including songs from the local area.
 - d. The Mandolin Orchestra of Devon and the Fiddle Orchestra of Devon meet monthly in Okehampton. Several members are from the town, and these groups bring day visitors everymonth.
 - e. Okehampton Lanterns: our annual lantern procession. Postponed in March 2020, but all equipment is in storage and we will be ready to go once restrictions are lifted in the longer term. The project works with all ages, family groups and groups targeted on particular communities (e.g. mental health support and residential homes). We also work with other localgroups such a Brownies, Room 13, dance groups and the multicultural feasts group.
 - f. Wren Music Folk Festival: Every October we bring professional folk artists to the town for a weekend celebration, including staying visitors from across the South West and further afield.

The grant will be used to help us stage the 2022 Okehampton Lantern Procession.

In 2020 the procession was scheduled for the first day of the first lockdown and was cancelled. At the time we thought we'd be back in one year! On 26 March 2022, almost exactly two years later to the day, we will have the rescheduled procession. We have some large lanterns in storage, and aim to make this project even bigger and more spectacular than ever, giving the town a much needed lift after the rigours of the pandemic. This is one of Wren Music's most successful projects in engaging with a whole range of families and vulnerable groups in the town.

This year we will be going out to more groups than in the past, and we have approached schools and special interest groups. A special feature this year will be to gather memories of spring from residents at Kent House, and to use these memories to inspire our lantern makers to build some special lanterns to be situated in the garden at Kent House ready to be taken into the procession, so the residents can feel included if they can't join in every step of the procession.

In addition, this year we will engage a video maker to make a promotional film promoting both the event, the work of Wren and Okehampton as a tourist destination.
