Memorial Safety Testing Okehampton Town Council Cemetery

Okehampton Town Council will be undertaking routine inspection of memorials in its Cemetery adjacent to All Saints Church in August 2022.

As the landowner, Okehampton Town Council is obliged to undertake this work to ensure that its cemetery is a safe place for the public to visit.

Under this safety testing programme all memorials will be tested by trained staff using industry approved testing procedures. Any memorials found to be unsafe will be either laid flat; secured with a temporary stake; or cordoned off to ensure that they do not present a risk to visitors to the cemetery.

Okehampton Town Council endeavours to carry out the inspections with minimal disruption. However, we would ask that any visitors to the cemetery take note of the warning signs and exercise caution near memorials during this testing.

Town Council Employees

The Newsletters often feature some information about your Councillors, but do you know who is at the end of the phone if you ring the Town Hall, who you speak to if you pop into the office, or who the council employs?

Town Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer, Mrs Emma James

The Clerk, also known as the 'Proper Officer', is the senior Council employee and is responsible for the day-to-day running of the council, management of other employees, buildings and facilities including the cemetery, managing projects, finance, ensuring compliance with law and procedures, summoning councillors to meetings and clerking them, as well as anything else that crops up.

Emma was employed by the council in 2017. She is a qualified clerk, having completed the Certificate in Local Council Administration (CiLCA) in 2017 and is now studying Level 4, Community Governance at De Montfort University in Leicester. In her spare time, she runs and cycles, completing her first marathon last year and cycling the Ride London Essex 100-mile bike ride in May with her husband and friends.

Assistant Clerk, Mrs Caroline Ellis - Caroline was employed by the Council in 2018 and is the Assistant Clerk whose main responsibility is the day-to-day management of the council's accounts followed by supporting the Clerk and clerking the Full Planning Committee meetings. Caroline is also CiLCA qualified.



Admin Officer and Mayor's Assistant, Mrs Abi Horn Abi, who was employed during the pandemic, is the newest member of office staff. Abi is kept busy managing reception and is the usually the person you will first speak to if you come into or ring the office. Also within Abi's remit is responsibility for booking the council's facilities, management of the Mayor's diary, and assisting the Clerk and Assistant Clerk in all manner of work, including arranging events such as the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations.

When not working Abi can be found looking after her family and menagerie which includes a herd of goats!

Caretakers, Mr Jonathan Dean and Mr Paul Tucker - The council employs two Caretakers who look after the buildings, including the Town Hall and Charter Hall. Jonathan, the Senior Caretaker and longest serving council employee is supported by Paul (Paulo). Between them they ensure the buildings are clean and ready for coffee mornings, council meetings, ceremonies in the Council Chamber and all kinds of other events that are booked.

Simmons Park and outdoor spaces that the council is responsible for is maintained by a team of three.

Park-Keeper, Mr James McGahey - Responsibility for the outdoor spaces falls to James. James can usually be found working away in Simmons Park, Clapps Wood, the BMX Track, in the Cemetery or a number of other places in Okehampton keeping the areas clean and tidy for the benefit of residents and visitors.

Groundsperson, Mr Neil Cleave – Neil can often be found in the tractor, cutting the grass, or completing other maintenance tasks including watering the Town Hall hanging baskets (or himself!).

Horticultural Apprentice, Mr Jacob Peek, Jacob is completing an Apprenticeship at Bicton College and is the newest member of the team, having started his apprenticeship in September last year.



Town Council Grants

This year, 2022/23, the Council has a budget of £29,000 for the award of grants supporting notfor-profit community organisations and groups for the benefit of the residents of Okehampton. Contact the office for details of how to apply or find them on the website.
