### Can you help? Okehampton Town Council is looking for land for a Cemetery

Available space for burials in the Cemetery adjacent to All Saints Church is gradually running out. It is estimated that within 5 years the Cemetery will be full. Some landowners near the cemetery have been approached but are unwilling to sell.

Ideally a new cemetery would be in the vicinity of All Saints

Church, but any offer would be gratefully considered by the Council. Cemetery locations are restricted and cannot be too close to a river, stream or other water source, it cannot be too steep, needs to be accessible by road and is subject to planning regulations.

# Town and Parish Council Elections – 4 May 2023

Did you know that the term of office for the existing Town Councillors comes to an end in May? Are you interested in **your** town and feel that **you** could make a difference in some way, that **you** could represent the best interests of the other residents?

No qualifications are needed to become a Councillor although there are some requirements that you will need to meet; for example, you will need to be over 18 years of age. Training will be available to assist you to become familiar with how local councils work, what they can and cannot do. All you need is commitment, the ability and willingness to learn and get involved, and are prepared to put aside time to attend Council/Committee meetings, which are usually on Monday evenings, read relevant papers and represent the council where required. As well as being members of Full Council, Councillors are nominated to sit on 2 of the 4 Committees and to take part in working groups which meeting during the day.

# **Town Council Grants**

This year, 2022/23, the Council has a budget of £29,000 for the award of grants supporting not-forprofit community organisations and groups for the benefit of the residents of Okehampton. The total amount of grants awarded to date this financial year stands at £24,285.13, final applications received for consideration this financial year will be considered by the Policy & Resources Committee on 13<sup>th</sup> March.

# DID YOU KNOW?

The Grant Application process is changing from 1st April 2023. This is primarily to ensure that all applicants are treated fairly and given the same opportunity without the risk of those who apply late in the financial year being affected by a diminished budget.

 Applications will be considered twice yearly; in May/June and in November/ December by the Policy & Resources (P&R)
Committee. Dates of the meetings at which applications will be considered will be published on the Council's website once confirmed. Emergency applications at other times of the year can be considered at the discretion of the P&R Committee.

Full details and the new forms can be found on the Council's website Final date for receipt of applications for consideration in May/June this year is Friday 10th March and Friday 8th September for the second round. However, in this first year of the new process, applications received after 10th March but before 21st April may still be considered in the first round at the discretion of the P&R Committee.

# 3<sup>rd</sup> April, Annual Town Assembly - Cyber Security Presentation

In accordance with the Local Government Act 1972, a meeting of the parish of Okehampton Town will be held at 7pm on 3<sup>rd</sup> April in the Charter Hall.

This is a meeting for the residents of the town. It is an opportunity to find out what the Council has been doing and what its plans are for the forthcoming year.

The long-planned repair work to the Charter Hall has been approved by the Council. Discussions with the contractor in relation to timescales are in progress and planning permission is awaited.





Working together Okehampton Town Council, Okehampton Hamlets Parish Council and Everything Okehampton are organising events to celebrate the Coronation.



A new noticeboard and map (below) linking the railway station to Simmons Park and the town centre has been installed at the station by the Town Council as part of a project part funded by GWR.




# **Refurbished Granite Trough**
