3rd April, Annual Town Assembly

In accordance with the Local Government Act 1972, a meeting of the parish of Okehampton Town will be held at 7pm on 3rd April in the Charter Hall.

This is a meeting for the residents of the town. It is an opportunity to find out what the Council has been doing and what its plans are for the forthcoming year.

Unfortunately, the planned Cyber Security presentation from Devon and Cornwall Police Cyber Protect Team has been cancelled as the presenter has been injured in an accident. Coronation of King Charles III, 6th May 2023

Working together Okehampton Town Council, Okehampton Hamlets Parish Council and Everything Okehampton are organising events to celebrate the Coronation. Everyone is welcome to attend these events - do come and join in. Saturday 6th May Morning

On Saturday morning at a time to be confirmed yet by Buckingham Palace the Coronation of King Charles III will be screened in the Charter Hall. During the morning a coffee morning will also be taking place with refreshments provided by the Inner Wheel.

Why not come down to the Charter Hall and watch the coronation in the company of old friends and new and share the memories of this rare occasion.

Saturday 6th May Afternoon

In the afternoon the celebrations continue. Moving out into St James' Street and around St James' Chapel there will be a bring and share street party. <u>Bandstand and Trees</u> As part of the Coronation Okehampton Town Council are in the process of reconfiguring the old bandstand in the park to add a new structure on the base. The bandstand has a plaque dedicating it to the Coronation of King George V so it was felt that this was the ideal place to have a memorial to the late Queen as well as to the Coronation of King Charles III. Simmons Park News

James, the Park-Keeper has provided an update on happenings in the park:



With some rather damp weather in the past couple of months a lot has still been accomplished and spring is in full flow in the park. Progress has been made on the rose garden with new gravel laid around it, a number of new roses planted and also the benches in there getting a much needed repaint with the final three to finish.

The typhoon swing has been closed for the past month while we renewed all the inner working on it and the tension ropes at the top. We are just waiting for parts to arrive to renew the seats so all moving parts will be new on it and we hope for it to be open for the Easter Holidays.

Within the past month a range of colour has started to show itself in the flower beds with some warmer days recently making it feel like spring has arrived. Considering how wet it was during their flowering period it was a very good year for the crocus which again have spread in all areas they are sited which is all part of the management we have in place to encourage



these to spread back to the amount there was in the park many years ago. Also the daffodils, snowdrops, primrose and magnolia stellate by the main gate are now flowering and the bluebells aren't far away.



A number of flowering cherry trees have been planted in the park bordering the car park which in time should in time give a nice colour to people's arrival into the park in spring. Also, a number of native species have been planted into areas where the diseased Ash trees once were.

Also, the ponds are now teeming with life with a lot of pond-skaters, caddisfly and dragonfly


larvae and with the majority of the tadpoles hatching the newt numbers in the ponds are on the rise again. This is all part of why the dogs aren't allowed in the ponds to protect the life in them and the dogs being on leads has aided this with plants growing now in the ponds and species numbers up.

The bird boxes are back up around the park and are getting a wide variety of interest from a number of species and we hope the pair of nuthatches will be back in the boxes this year after they had a successful year last year in one of our boxes.

With conditions hopefully warming and drying up in the next month we have the wildflower area by Westbridge to rotavate and apply an overseed to. At the skatepark we will be carrying out some running resurfacing repairs to and hopefully finish the outdoor painting before the grass mowing begins in full force.

Okehampton Police Desk Reopening

Alison Hernandez, Police & Crime Commissioner has confirmed that the police enquiry office in Okehampton will be reopening in the 2023/24 financial year between the hours of 10am - 3pm Monday to Saturday.

Public Emergency Alerts

A siren-like alert will be sent to smartphone users across the UK next month to test a new government public warning system. More information can be found on the <u>Government website</u>.

The alert allows the government and emergency services to send urgent messages warning the public of life-threatening situations like flooding or wildfires.

The test is expected to take place in the early evening of 23 April.

Phone users will have to acknowledge the alert before they can use other features on their devices. A message will appear on the home screens of people's devices during the test, with vibration and a loud warning sound that will ring for about 10 seconds, even if the phone is set to silent.

The system - which became operational on Sunday - is being modelled on similar schemes used in the US, Canada, Japan and The Netherlands. Emergency alerts work on all 4G and 5G phone networks and will not include older "non-smart" phones, the government said.

Messages would only ever come from the government or emergency services and will initially focus on the most serious weather-related events, with the ability to get a message to 90% of mobile users within the relevant area.

Terror alerts could be added to the list of potential events that would trigger a notification. The messages will include details of the area impacted and instructions about how to respond. They will only be sent where there is an immediate risk to life and many people may not receive an alert for months or years.

People can opt out by searching their device settings for emergency alerts and then turning off severe and extreme ones.

Town Council Grants

In the 2022/23 financial year which came to an end on 31st March, the Council had £29,000 budgeted for the award of grants supporting not-for-profit community organisations and groups for the benefit of the residents of Okehampton. The total amount of grants awarded within that year amounted to £26.922.63.

The process for applying for a grant from the Council has now changed, details can be found on the website along with the new forms and policy or obtained from the office. £29,000 is budget for the award of grants in this new 2023/24 financial year.
