50	<p><u>Public Participation</u> – Cllr Weekes who was not a member of the Committee raised concern that Okehampton was losing retail premises in the town as they were changing to dwellings. The Chairman explained that it was to do with market forces and there was nothing the Council could do regarding this as the Council did not own any retail premises. The Council was being consulted in a proposed BID which may allow a platform for businesses to have a say. Cllr Weekes also asked if the Town Council could work with WDBC to look after the small play areas in the town. It was explained that the Town Council had taken over some areas in the past and more costs had incurred. It was suggested this matter was discussed with the Parks Committee.</p>

65 **Member's Reports and Requests for Agenda Items –**

65.1 **Dartmoor Railway Association** – Cllr Ireland attended the AGM on 24th May 2023. The Chair gave an extensive review of the year. Okehampton had been entered for the 'World Cup of Stations' award and had reached the regional finals. Okehampton was not successful in reaching the finals.

An election of officers and members of the Committee was held, with all returned unopposed. A talk was given by a retired engine driver who recalled his time on the footplate, from the age of steam to working high speed trains to Paddington.

Dartmoor Railway Association were represented at the Oke Rail Coffee Morning in the Charter Hall on 27th May 2023

- 65.2 OkeRail Forum** – Oke Rail Forum held a meeting in the Charter Hall on 20th April 2023. Oke Rail thanked OTC staff for help with the Coffee Morning and would make a donation to the Mayor’s Charity to show their appreciation. The morning was attended by rail groups including ACE Rail (Barnstaple to Bideford reinstatement group), Connect Bude (Okehampton to Bude rail group) and TavyRail (Plymouth to Tavistock Service). A questionnaire to ascertain the public’s view on rail services was circulated by Cllr Ball (WDBC) and collected with the assistance of Cllr Yelland. The event concluded with a prize draw, thank you to local business for their donations.
- 65.3 Ockment Centre** – Cllr Leech reported various groups were using the Centre. The Ockment Centre was run by Trustees and solely financed by grants and room hire income. Applications for more funding may need to be made as building maintenance was urgently required.
