Okehampton Celebrates the 400th Anniversary of the Town Charter – 9th July

Come and join us in Simmons Park for a day of celebration. The Town Council working in partnership with The Museum of Dartmoor Life, Okehampton United Charities (OUC) and Okehampton Hamlets Parish Council (OHPC), have commissioned a timeline of some of the events that have happened in Okehampton over the last 400 years.

Come and visit the marguee and see the historical timeline, where there will be free refreshments provided by OCRA and some activities on offer hosted by OUC, OHPC and the Town Council. At 2pm in the marquee the anniversary cakes marking 400 years of the Charter, 150 years of Okehampton United Charities and 125 years of Okehampton Hamlets Parish Council will be cut.

Devon County Council: Free activities and meals available to eligible children over the school summer holiday

For many families, the school summer holiday can be difficult and stressful time, particularly with the cost of food and childcare, which can quickly mount up.

That's why we're inviting children aged five to 16 years old, who receive benefit-related free school meals, to take part in a range of exciting activities over the school summer holidays.

Once again, we have teamed up with over 60 different activity providers across Devon to offer a great range of indoor and outdoor activities as part of the Government-funded Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme, which offers free activities and healthy meals during the school holidays.

Activities range from sports such as football and kayaking to other activities like gardening, outdoor treasure hunts, and craft sessions. Some providers are offering special visits from storytellers, magicians, animals, and trips to local attractions. And this year, there are more places available for secondary school aged children and young people, with activities including go-karting, climbing, trampolining, high ropes and surfing.

Abbeyford Woods

Whilst Abbeyford Woods is located outside of the town boundary, please see information received from a Forestry England Community Ranger:

I am writing to let you know that forestry operations are due to start at Abbeyford woods in late August. It is expected the operation will last 8-10 weeks.

For safety reasons we will have to stop public access Monday-Friday for the duration of the operation on the Springetts side of forest. The forest will be open over the weekends.

A Statutory Plant Health Notice was issued due to the presence of <u>Phytophthora Ramorum</u>, it causes extensive damage and death to more than 150 plant species. Larch trees are particularly susceptible and are very good at transmitting the pathogen. Therefore all the Larch (infected or not) has to be felled and removed from the site. Please see the attached pdf for the areas where Larch will be removed.

The felled areas will look stark but they will quickly green up, allowing different habitats to form and then when the ground has rested the area will be replanted in line with the forest plan. Replanting will focus on native and broadleaf species in the Planted on Ancient Woodland Site (PAWS) areas with an emphasis to improve Dormouse habitats and corridors. The smaller non-PAWS area will be replanted with a mix of species that may be better suited to the changing climate but in keeping with the rest of the forest.
