Devon County Council On-Street Parking Charges Proposal

Devon County Council (DCC) are proposing to introduce a payment system for on-street parking in areas of Okehampton town centre. DCC's view is that this will increase parking turnover, reduce congestion and ensure onstreet parking enforcement, for which they are responsible, is efficient and sustainable. Any surplus income, DCC say, will be used to help fund management transport and traffic related services, including bus subsidies.

volunteer session went really well with no issues, we met the 6 volunteers that could make the session on the day by the front gate of the park at 11am. I introduced myself and gave the group the chance to introduce themselves to each other. I then explained the tasks planned for the session which included weeding the front flowerbeds along the main path. I explained to the group the weeds that needed removing, Stinging nettles, dandelions and docks, making sure that if anyone was unsure they asked me before removing it.

Once this was all explained I left them to make a start on the areas specified and then spent time with each member of the group helping them and explaining some of the weeds and plants that are in this area. During the session I took multiple questions and had to point out some weeds that had been missed. One of the volunteers wanted to dead head some of the roses so I showed him the correct method in how to carry that out. Each volunteer had a bucket which they emptied in a pile for us to add to the compost heap we have on site which will then be spread on the flowerbeds in the spring.

Overall this has had a massive impact on my learning, improving my knowledge of supervising a group and helping to understand and learn how to manage a group of people. It also tested me on my own knowledge of weeds and plants we have in the park. It was a very beneficial session and I look forward to the next session on October 3rd 11-12.30."
