Hello 2024 ...

As we welcome 2024 and say goodbye to 2023 we wonder what this new year will bring to us all, and from myself as Town Clerk, I would like to take this opportunity to wish you a happy and healthy year.

In the first few weeks of 2024 Okehampton Town Council is:

- awaiting the result of its petition to West Devon Borough Council for amendment to the boundary between itself and its neighbouring parish of Okehampton Hamlets which is expected towards the end of February;
- budgeting for the 2024/25 financial year so that it can continue to support its community and provide facilities including CCTV, public toilets and Simmons Park for the benefit of all;
- continuing to support its residents by objecting strongly to DCC's pay and display consultation to implement on-street parking charging in the Okehampton, and working with the other communities who are also objecting to similar schemes;
- developing and improving communication by considering the provision of additional noticeboards and investigating how it can more effectively engage and listen to young people;
- engaging with other stakeholders towards the potential creation of a Business Improvement District to support traders and assist the economy of the town.

DCC's Pay and Display Consultation for the Implementation of Charging for On-Street Parking

Around 100 people turned out for the public meeting hosted by the Town Council in the Ockment Centre on 14th December to voice their opinions about DCC's proposals. In attendance were the majority of the Town Councillors, some Councillors from WDBC and Cllr Samuel from DCC.

Chaired by the Town Mayor, Cllr Allenton Fisher, attendees made it very clear the proposals were not supported with not one person being in favour. The Town Council continues to support its residents and traders by objecting to the proposals and will be submitting its own response to the consultation by the closing date of 7th January.

Numbers count, and the Town Council urges everyone to complete the survey if you have not yet done so, with the reminder that each person in a household should individually fill it out. <u>The form can be accessed through this link</u>.

Charter Hall Roofing Work and Closure

The long-planned repairs and improvements to the roof of the Charter Hall are due to commence on 19th February 2024. It is expected that the work will take 5 months to complete but in total the hall is anticipated to be closed until September 2024 to allow some time for internal TLC to also take place before it reopens.

Other facilities in the Town Hall including the Council Chamber and Committee Room will remain open and bookable for meetings, events and Ceremonies.
