11. <u>Website Accessibility</u> – To consider a report from the website provider in relation to compliance with WCAG 2.2 Level AA

Please see the following report from the audit undertaken in May 2025:

The website has been audited against the latest accessibility requirements – WCAG 2.2 Level AA. Checks were made on all pages.

On a couple of editable pages there was evidence of copying and pasting from formatted documents or attempts to copy and paste pictures. These resulted in a large amount of spurious HTML code on these pages. The pages were cleaned up and spurious code removed.

The enquiry forms and community entry and update forms used a Google Recaptcha, to cut down non-human submission of these forms. The version of ReCaptcha has been updated to the latest version to comply with WCAG 2.2

The maps on the Simmons Park pages are not accessible. Both maps do have some descriptive text, although in the case of the Facilities map this does not match the (virtually unreadable) text on the map. These maps would be better presented as PDF documents which can be printed.

The maps referred to on the Simmons Park pages are too large to add to the website as PDF documents and the website contractor has been requested to investigate and advise how this can be achieved.
