243 Apologies for Absence

Apologies tendered by Cllr Fisher (personal), Holt (personal) and Cllr Hart (illness) were **approved** on the proposition of Cllr Cummings, seconded Cllr Leech.

247. West Devon Borough Council

Reports from Cllr Leech and Cllr Dexter had been previously circulated

Cllr Dexter expanded on the Local Government Association (LGA) and the WDBC community engagement event that both he and Cllr Leech had attended. The Link Road had opened in the last few weeks following negotiation with the relevant parties enabling the road to be opened earlier than planned to assist with the road closure pressures. A member of the public who had spent a lot of time assisting was thanked. Other matters from within Cllr Leech's report were expanded upon including footpaths and Kellands Lane.

250. <u>Adoption of Minutes of Committees and to Receive Questions from Members</u> Thereon

250.1 On the proposition of Cllr Leech, seconded Cllr Bird it was **RESOLVED** to adopt the minutes of the **Policy & Resources Committee** meetings held 21st July and 18th August 2025.

251. Full Council Meeting Minutes

On the proposition of Cllr Yelland, seconded Cllr Tolley it was **RESOLVED** to approve the minutes of the Town Council meetings held on 28th July and 18th August 2025 for signing by the Mayor.

252. Projects and Consultations

252.1 English Devolution White Paper/Local Government Reorganisation

The meeting with WDBC to investigate potential transfer of assets and services had been rescheduled to 2nd December 2025.

252.2 Community Governance Boundary Review

Correspondence relating to the transfer of assets from Okehampton Hamlets Parish Council was awaited. The Clerk was working on FAQs for consideration of the Council at a later meeting.

252.3 Okehampton Neighbourhood Plan

On the proposition of Cllr Richards, seconded Cllr Cummings it was **RESOLVED** to approve the area to be included in the Neighbourhood Plan and accompanying statement to be submitted to WDBC.

252.4 Pulse Smart Hubs

Planning consent for one of hubs to be located in West Street had been submitted.

252.5 Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP)

Cllr Leech, being a Member of WDBC, declared a personal interest.

In principle the council were supportive of the ideas, many of which were described as excellent but not suitable for Okehampton. In most areas the widening of pavements and narrowing of roads was not a practical solution, and removal of roadside parking would likely lead to an increase in vehicular speed and exacerbate the already difficult parking situation, for example in Station Road.

Whilst the promotion of cycling was acknowledged to be of benefit, it was commented that 'when places of work are 20 miles away and the topography of the town is that only experienced by a spider in a bathtub', then Okehampton is not an ideal location for cycling from. It was felt that the spending of funding on other projects such as a shuttle bus, secure cycle storage and charging facilities would be more beneficial.

On the proposition of Cllr Yelland, seconded Cllr Cummings (1 abstention) it was **RESOLVED** that the Clerk respond to the proposals in accordance with the comments made. Review of the proposals by the Council could be undertaken once town congestion, infrastructure and footpath issues had been resolved.

252.6 North Dartmoor Health Initiative

Cllr Yelland declared a personal interest.

A <u>survey</u> which could be completed by councillors as individuals was noted. The demographic of responses to date was mainly of the older generation and it was reported that some were not able to complete the electronic survey. Younger people to be encouraged to complete the survey through the schools, Youth Council and Health Watch.

253. Letters of Recognition

On the proposition of Cllr Marsh, seconded Cllr Weekes (1 abstention) it was **RESOLVED** to support a proposal from Cllr Colman for a letter of recognition for service of 10 years or more to members of the emergency services, in accordance with the circulated report. The letter would be personalised on an individual basis.

On the proposition of Cllr Marsh, seconded Cllr Bird it was **RESOLVED** to approve payment of invoices in accordance with the schedule, the BACS payments which included September salaries totalling £30,149.67. The schedule included the SWW direct debit invoice missing from the previous week, and the Clerk confirmed the payment to Buzzweld was for the purchase of paint for Jubilee Bridge.
